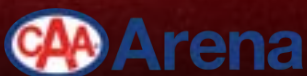

The newly renovated 4,400-seat building is home to the Belleville Senators of the American Hockey League, as well as a number of regional minor hockey teams and tournaments, alternative sporting competitions, trade shows, concerts and special events.

BELLEVILLE SENATORS COMMUNITY IMPACT

The Belleville Senators are proud to announce the fundraising totals from the club's community initiatives last season, included in this season's Community Impact Report.

Over the course of the 2022-2023 campaign, the Sens were able to donate \$246,996.31 back to community groups and charities in the Bay of Quinte Region and beyond, through various events and activations. Those included the CAA Chuck-A-Puck program, 50/50 draw and specialty jersey auctions for Hockey Fights Cancer and History of Hockey nights, with funds also raised through the sale of memorabilia like signed pucks and sticks in the CAA Arena Community Alley.

The team also donated more than **2,600** tickets over the course of the season to local first responders, military members, Indigenous groups and more, including the BP Buddies program (supporting The Children's Foundation, United Way Hastings & Prince Edward, Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Hastings & Prince Edward, and the YMCA of Central East Ontario).

Along with the monetary donations, Belleville Senators players and staff gave their time visiting 21 schools across the Quinte Region, interacting with more than **4,000** students and handing out thousands of team-made activity and colour books along the way, while also taking part in multiple community events and parades both through the season and last summer.

Community Impact has been a cornerstone of the Senators' mission since moving to the Bay of Quinte for their inaugural season in 2017-2018, with this season's fundraising total once again setting a new benchmark as the team's community initiatives and impact continue to grow.

While equipment damage will always present itself in professional hockey, the Senators will continue designing programs to help offset these losses and benefit their community.

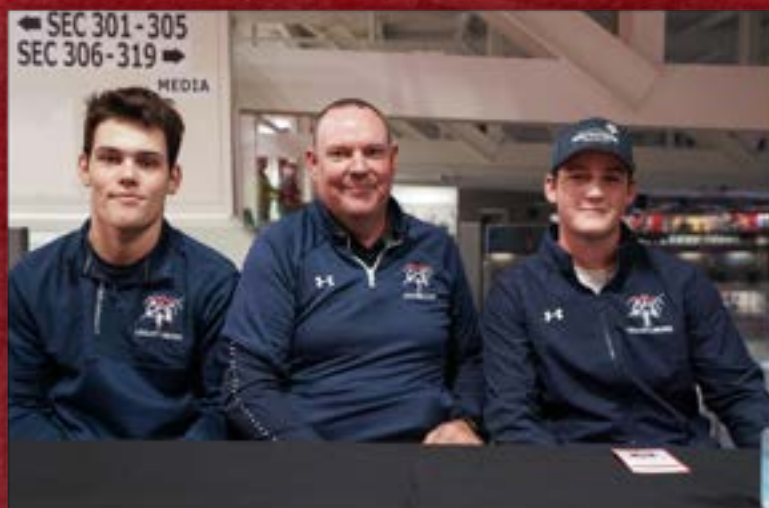

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

The Belleville Senators are an optimistic group. Perhaps that is true because few organizations can boast such an impressive group of skilled prospects.

General Manager Ryan Bowness is particularly enthusiastic about the development and progress of the next wave of organizational talent. They have demonstrated the skill, scoring, leadership, and defensive acumen which all franchises require to be successful.

At the end of the day, this is a development league, and our coaching staff has done a wonderful job of making sure that happens. Seeing the growth in some of our players like Egor Sokolov, Angus Crookshank and Maxence Guenette. Watching Ridly Greig go up and down and play some meaningful minutes in Ottawa. I think we have to draw on the positives there and monitor the players that have improved over the course of the season."

While it is true that the Senators failed to qualify for the Calder Cup playoffs, Bowness quickly acknowledged that although the 2022-2023 campaign had a fair share of adversity, he was ultimately impressed that his club was able to finish with a respectable record of 31-31-6-4.

"Anytime you miss the playoffs, the way we did here, there's certainly a level of disappointment. I think we have to look at the bigger picture and realize some of the adversity we went through this year. Obviously, with the injury situation having to use 53 players and ten goaltenders certainly doesn't help things."

While there is always dissatisfaction in a campaign when a team finishes outside of the postseason, Bowness was ultimately proud of the Senators' resolve and effort throughout the campaign.

"We fought really hard until the end and then rebounded from a slow start. It could have gone either way. With a little bit of a break here and there, again pointing back to the injury situation, it could have been a different story. But you know we don't like to dwell on the what-if."
